

Welcome to our Term 3 Newsletter

This has been a busy term for active schools with lots of activity going on in all of the clusters. In January we launched an initiative to encourage primary pupils to be rewarded for taking part in sport locally outside of school hours. This included not just the range of Active Schools activities at lunchtimes/after school but also extended to community clubs and recreational activities that can be done with parents.

It was called 'Midlothian Commonwealth Passport' to coincide with the games in the Gold Coast games back in April. Pupils were able to record on a passport card an record each activity for up to ten times over the five month period, we also allowed a wild card sport and for one to take place outside the authority.

All pupils taking part had their names in a draw with a chance to win a family tubing session, Ryze vouchers, free places at the councils summer holiday programmes and free family swim sessions to name a few of those on offer.

School prizes were also available, Rosewell had the highest percentage of returned forms and won a visit from rugby player Scott Riddell with Roslin and Glencorse receiving equipment vouchers for second and third respectively.

Of all the pupils took part in the passport initiative received either a gold, silver or bronze water bottle depending on how many activities they completed. A fantastic achievement by all the pupils and their parents who would have been heavily involved in encouraging and making arrangements for the opportunities and we hope it continues.

We believe to have not just encouraged more pupils to be active and try new sports but also to promote the many opportunities available across Midlothian to the benefit of not just council facilities but also the clubs and organisations we work with throughout the year.



Local Sports Clubs Supporting Active Schools Festivals

Over the last two terms there have been many Active Schools Festivals for a number of sports. A lot of hard work goes in to organising these popular events, not just form the Active Schools team but from many local sports clubs. There are many ways in which these clubs help us to organise and deliver our festivals and we would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge their support and the pathways they provide pupils. Of course, we cannot forget to celebrate the achievements of the pupils and schools who attend.

Basketball

In March, we ran our second Basketball festival of the year. This event would lead the first and second place schools through to the Lothian Regional Finals, to be held at the Oriam Sports Centre on the 6th June. This event was very popular with schools, so much so that we had to adapt our usual format as so many teams signed up. With so many teams attending it was great to have the support of High Flyers Basketball Club and Midlothian Basketball Academy. These two clubs were able to referee the games to the same standard that games will be refereed at the Lothian Finals, helping to prepare the two qualifiers.

There were a number of close games with some great displays of sportsmanship. The final points were very close but well done to the teams from Loanhead and Danderhall Primary Schools who finished first and second respectively.

Hockey

Our annual Hockey Festival took place in March. This event is always well supported by Eskvale Hockey Club who provide referees and help to run the event. This year's event was won by Paradykes with Cornbank finishing in second place. This meant Paradykes can attend the National Finals in June and both schools were invited to attend the Regional Final which took place on Thursday 17th May. The



Regional Final was a great morning of hockey with both teams winning some of their games. Well done to Paradykes and Cornbank Primary Schools for making it to this event, what a great achievement!

The Lasswade Festival had a record number of P5 classes sign up, so the support Broomieknowe Golf Club offered was going to be essential. The club liaised with the Lasswade Coordinators to arrange volunteers to support the event and offered to bring equipment. Although, in the end, their help was not required, the offer was greatly appreciated.


Athletics

Termly Sport in Focus - Cricket in Midlothian

Founded in 1844, Penicuik Cricket Club ranks amongst one of the oldest clubs in Scotland and is currently Midlothian's only Cricket club. For a number of years now, Active Schools has had extremely positive links with the Cricket Club, sharing the common goal of introducing the sport to as many local school pupils as possible, with a view to developing the 'Clubs Junior Section. This link has become particularly impactful over the past 3 years, on the arrival of Jack Hilton, who is leading the charge on what appears to be a very focussed and determined one-man Cricket crusade.

Since returning from a winter spent in New Zealand in April (developing Cricket!) Jack has put some very ambitious, yet achievable, plans in place. He will be offering taster sessions in most Penicuik area primary schools over the coming months, with the possibility of then also delivering some tasters in the Lasswade area schools. In addition to this, Jack is currently delivering a lunchtime Cricket session at Roslin primary school, with 15 pupils attending, with these positive numbers testament to Jack's coaching quality, drive and enthusiasm.

On Tuesday 22nd May, over 250 primary school pupils attended the annual Active Schools cricket festival. The pupils took part in several Kwik Cricket games over the course of a morning – held in the grounds of Penicuik Cricket Club - it was a fantastic spectacle and introduction to Cricket for all that attended.

Penicuik Cricket Club, which celebrates 175 years in operation in 2019, welcome all primary school pupils in p1 – age 10 to come along to their weekly junior training sessions which run every Friday from 5.30 – 6.30pm at their home ground on Kirkhill Road, Penicuik.

The club is also currently promoting 'All Stars Cricket' for 5-8 year olds which will run from Friday 19th May – 18th August, 4.30 – 5.15pm. Pupils signing up to these sessions will receive a personalised bag, bat, ball, t-shirt, cap & water bottle.
